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Dear Friends of Heart Care Ministries,

Recently someone requested the words of a poem I often quote, especially when a person cries easily or sometimes when there seems to be a struggle showing any emotion. I have sit with a number of people who have never or seldom been seen shedding a tear. I rarely remember seeing my dad cry but when his mother, my grandmother passed away I saw him wipe a little trickle from his eye. I was 9 years old. Obviously we are all made up differently and some are much more open to express emotion than others. The ways people respond to someone showing emotions can be varied as well. If a person has grown up with someone that has been emotionally expressive it may have caused them to become callous and unable to show sympathy when people hurt or grieve. We live in a society that has become much more intellectual in our social interaction and scientific in explaining away our feelings. While it is true that feelings are fickle, unreliable and can be distracting when making objective decisions, they are God given indicators that offer insight into the heart. When we squelch, avoid or simply ignore our feelings we risk losing an opportunity to identify causes and allowing truth to provide us the means to release. There are also people who have lost touch with their feelings. I have a series of questions I often have couples ask each other as homework. When they return for the next session the question that frequently tends to trip them up in this interaction is when asked "Has anyone ever cared for your emotional needs?" The most common response is "they are not sure what that question is asking" or "they don't even know what their emotional needs are" and that is sad. Pro. 14:10 states "The heart knows its own bitterness..." This is simply saying the heart should be in touch with what it feels. Professionals are trained to detach from their feelings so they can be objective and focus on their expertise. This works well when accomplishing a task or performing a duty, but falls way short when it comes to developing relationships. Jesus himself wept when Lazarus died Jn. 11:35, was in deep sorrow in Gethsemane Mt 26:38 and when he saw the city of Jerusalem Lk.19:41. In his tears we witness his humanity and the reality that Jesus was in touch with his feelings and able to express them. It is because of this we are assured that He is "touched with the feeling of our infirmities..." and understands the personal pain in our heart. That is why Jesus is the most safe and sure place to share our hearts. The NKJV version of Pro.29:11 states "A fool vents all his feelings, But a wise man holds them back." I would suggest this to mean that not everyone is safe to open up to or share our heart with. Many people have been hurt confiding in someone only to be criticized, ignored or betrayed resulting in losing confidence or greatly affecting their ability to trust anyone. Humanity is imperfect at best. Jesus is perfect and therefore safe to trust our hearts completely to his care. The hymn describes Him well "No one understands like Jesus, Every woe He sees and feels; Tenderly He whispers comfort, And the broken heart He heals."
